Hello everybody. It's been great to be around the Club.

Three months into the year and it feels as like things are getting busier. We had a great turnout for the March meeting on Sunday morning. Red plate inspections were undertaken, coffee was on supply nice and hot and with thanks to Andrew and Joe we all enjoyed a BBQ lunch.

As you will be aware the Executive Committee saw the need to have the Clubhouse inspected to ensure compliance with fire safety standards. This in turn necessitated a fire evacuation drill which was executed at the last meeting. Well done to all the members who promptly and calmly evacuated when Michael Camilleri made the call to evacuate and move to the muster point designated at the rear of the Clubhouse. Drew Jessop and Richard Stewart were the evacuation wardens. They completed a thorough sweep of the building and then gave the all clear to return.

Moving forward we will be conducting an evacuation drill once a year to ensure the Club is compliant and members know the procedure in the event that an evacuation is required. The Executive Committee along with the Club Committee, will meet to debrief and review the evacuation drill to discuss any changes that may need to be made to streamline or improve it including the possibility of moving the muster point from the containers to the rear gate entering the Steam Club compound.

The main water feed to the Club sprang a leak last week and our resident plumber was sent out to have a look at it. Once he dug up the ground around the leak it was discovered that the pipe had been repaired once before and that the standard of repair was not great and needed to be done again. The repair has now been completed. In the future, a second isolating point into the Club will be added as the Clubhouse itself cannot be isolated independently from the whole compound. An inspection of the toilets and kitchen area also highlighted the need to look at all the rubber connections to the toilet bowls and connections to the sinks, possibly applying isolating valves at each point. This will be discussed at the upcoming Committee meeting.

I attended Coffee and Cars on Sunday. It was a cool morning weather wise, with a little drizzle. Not as many cars as usual, nonetheless it was still good to catch up with members again.

Minutes:

Minutes of the meeting held 1st February 2023 have been distributed. Moved: Geoff Buchanan, Seconded: Joe Parnis that the minutes be accepted. Carried.

President: President Adam detailed his report as summarized in this month Motor Mouth.

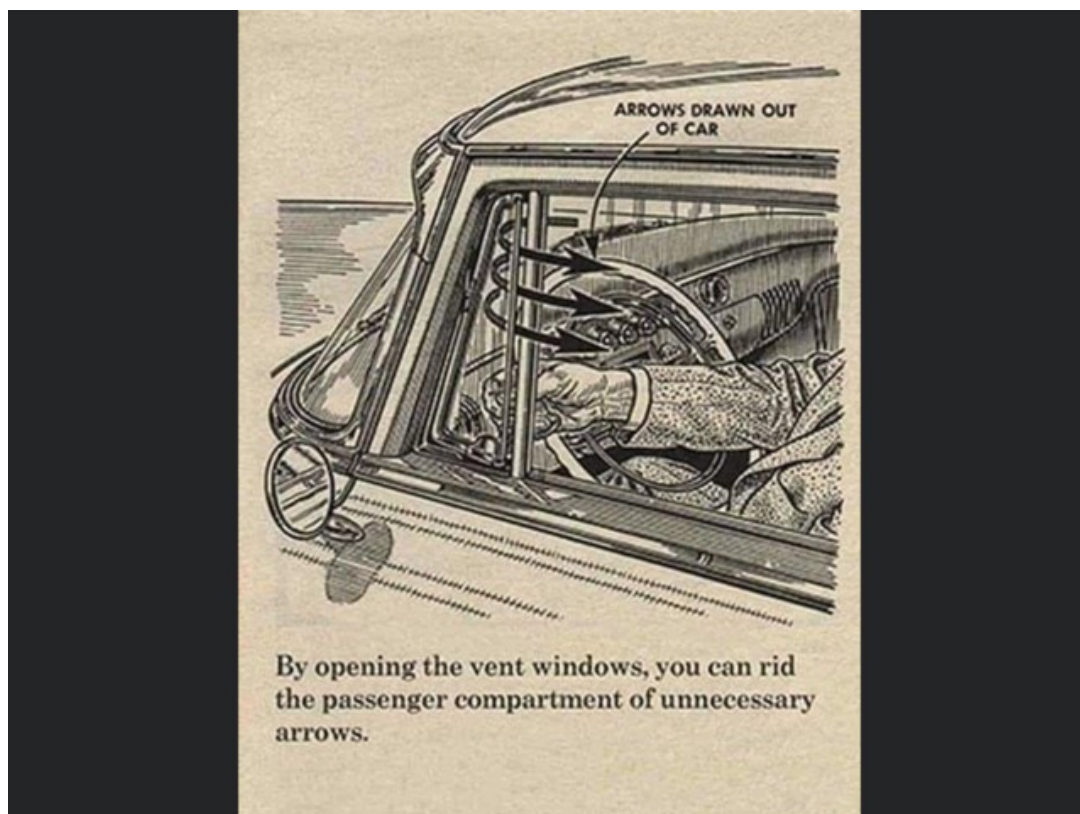
Car part for sale – Drew Jessop has a working Falcon XA or XB GT clock for sale.



John Bowe Kicks Off 2023 Season

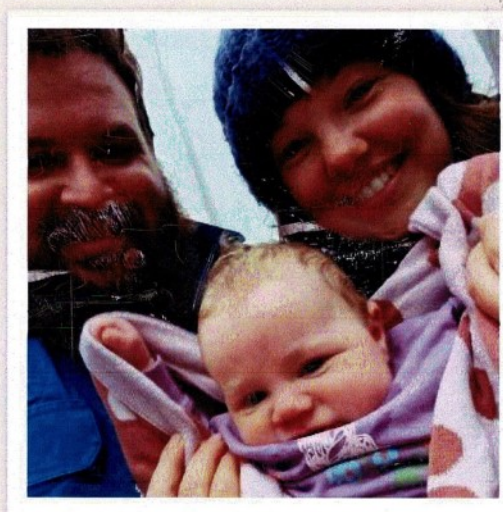

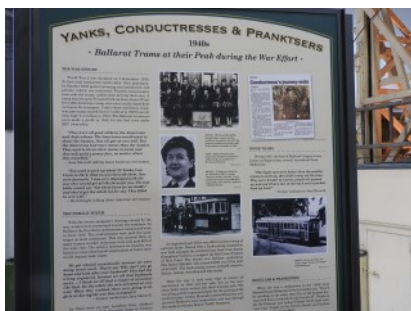
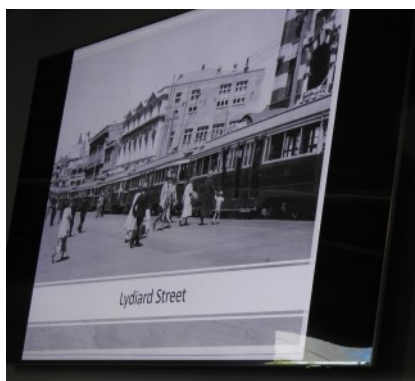
The March Mid Week Run headed off to Ballarat to the Tramways Museum with Roger and Elizabeth Payne leading the way as our road captains.

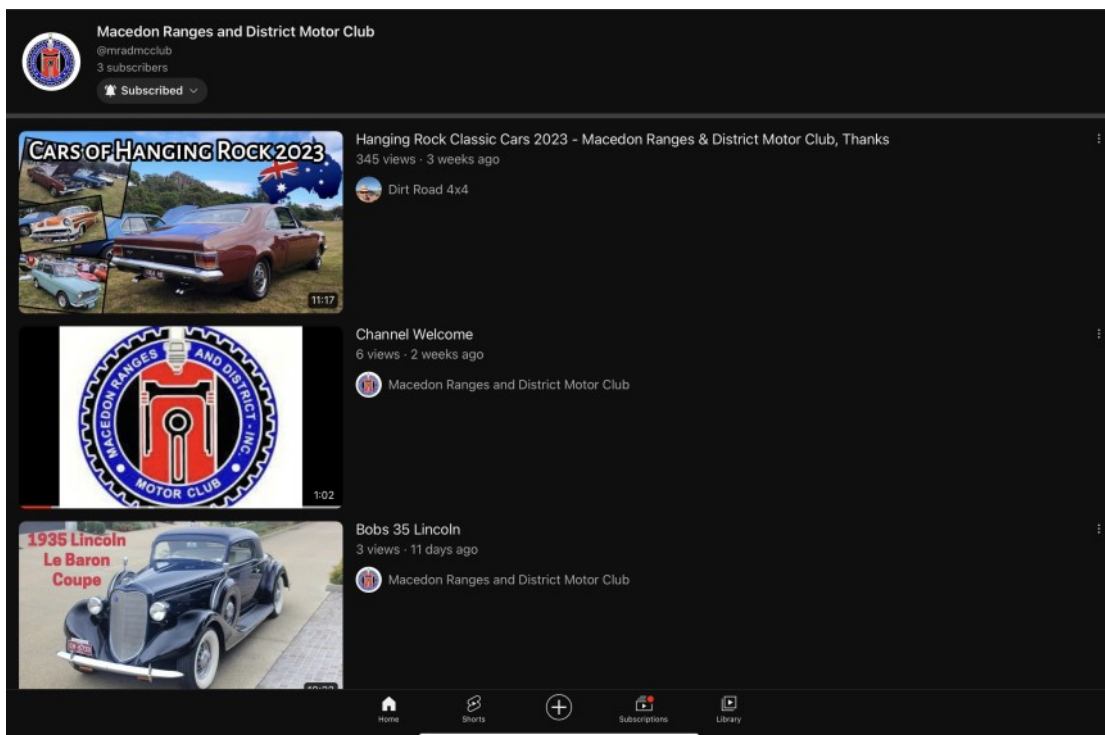
